## Why are we here?

The Mission of the El Paso County Nature Centers is to connect people to their natural and cultural resources and inspire them to become stewards for the environment





#### Community Service, Community Impact

27,000 individuals participated in programs at Fountain Creek and Bear Creek Nature last year

70 Volunteers donated more than 7,000 hours of time last year

New Exhibits opened at Fountain Creek and Bear Creek Nature Center

- Students from 15+ area schools and multiple School Districts served
- Week-Long Outdoor Summer Camps served youth at Nature Centers
- Ages from Pre-School to Active Adult served with targeted programing
- Create lasting Outdoor Experiences, Environmental Education, and Culture of Stewardship

## Why Now?

 "Continue to Improve and Update the County Park System Including Parks, Trails, Open Space, Nature Centers, Fairgrounds and Services"

"The Master Plan proposes the addition of a new nature center in Northern El Paso County....[that will] provide nature-based programming and will maintain the diversity and quality of and participation in awardwinning environmental education programs"

## Why Now?

- Use of The Nature Centers, demand for services and support has grown rapidly during a time when the El Paso County's population has more than doubled.
- Growing awareness of Nature Deficit Disorder and the idea that many children and families spend less time outdoors with a potential for greater alienation from natural world.
- A feasibility study has been funded in 2018 to analyze and evaluate location, potential partnerships/collaborations, public support, revenue sources, construction costs, and long-term maintenance and staffing.

## Project Purpose

- 2 Miles of Trails
- 7723 sq. ft. Interior Building Space
- 736 sq. ft. Presentation Patio
- 36 total Parking Spaces


- Located in western foothills of Bear Creek

#### Fountain Creek Nature Center



320 Peppergrass Ln, Fountain, CO

- 0.8 Miles of Trails
- 4881 sq. ft. Interior Building Space
- 530 sq. ft. Observation Deck
- 46 Total Parking Spaces

- Located south of Colorado Springs along Fountain Creek
- Features wetland, riparian and prairie ecosystems
- Wetlands, ponds and other aquatic features define the property
- Plentiful wildlife include numerous bird species are present
- Building and exhibit expansion in 2014



#### Wish List


Below is a Wish List that would enhance the services the Arboretum provides to the community.

#### CONSERVATION

- . \$100 -Sponsor One Linear Foot of Arboretum Boardwalk
- Many of the trails pass through low-lying areas, which require boardwalks so that visitors may use the trails regardless of recent rains. The boardwalks must be maintained or replaced, and in some cases widened from the current 4 feet to ADA mandated 6 feet to enable anyone to tour the trails. The Arboretum has plans to replace 539 feet of boardwalk.
- \$250 -Sponsor a Truckload of Mulch for Trails
- In order to minimize walkers' impact upon the trails, and to reduce the trails' muddy impact on the walkers, mulch is spread over trails that are not boardwalk or gravel. One truckload covers 100 linear feet of trail, improving the appearance of the trail and reducing wear and tear upon Nature.
- \$500 -Sponsor a Truckload of Crushed Limestone
- The Outer Loop, last resurfaced in 1992, needs 600 truckloads of stone. Erosion and normal wear have created low spots prone to standing water, which reduces the easy foot traffic normally enjoying access to the outermost areas of the Arboretum.
- . \$1,000 -Remove Invasives and Restore One Acre of Forest
- Underwrite the removal of invasive species such as privet, Japanese honeysuckle or air potato from the Arboretum grounds, and replant the area with native plants. Do your part to help us realize our mission of protecting and enhancing the native environment.
- . \$2,000 -Support a Summer Conservation Intern
- As part of their training, graduate students in conservation come to the Arboretum for experience. Your


